Gamilaraay is an Indigenous Australian language from the mid-northwest of NSW that is currently undergoing revitalisation. This course will provide students with a basic competence in speaking, understanding, reading and writing Gamilaraay sufficient to recognise and construct simple utterances in the language, and to understand its relationships with other languages.

Assessment components include: (1) the quality of Gamilaraay oral/aural

performance and the ability to use Gamilaraay in simple conversations, (2) regular short written tasks, (3) a final project including the production of a Gamilaraay learning resource which demonstrates the student's written and oral skills.
